Character transliterated with Underdot is represented as a character with a dot after it, e.g., z., d., t., etc.

"Key" indicates corresponding key on the English qwerty keyboard to the MS keyboard layout Arabic 101. (Correspondence to the 4 characters from the Persian alphabet is not indicated.)
