

BAHA TO LIVE IN MONTCLAIR.

Famous Persian Religious Leader
Takes a House There.

MONTCLAIR, N. J., June 1.—Abdul Baha, the great Persian religious leader and head of the Bahaists, who number 14,000,000 throughout the world, will make his home in Montclair. The Persian prophet, who has spent forty of his seventy years in prison because of his religious beliefs, has taken the house at 11 Bradford Place, in this town, and will live there after June 15.

Abdul Baha recently spoke in Unity Church here, and was so impressed by the reception he received and by the physical aspects of the town that he expressed a desire to take up his abode in the town. There are about fifty Bahaists in Montclair.
