late - Had telegraphed to Hotel
d'Angleterre - and found the
room would not be vacant until
7 P.M. Went out and had tea in
Piazza Spagna - Hot eggs & butter
Strike among waiters, so every
one is doing the work - No
breakfast in room -

Tried: starting at 9 -
Pray that my trip may be
fruitful of good results.
Lively and excitement in the
streets. Some said revolution.
Carabinieri out.

Clear. Jan 28 - Friday
Retired last night at 9:30
and did not get up until 11:30
Telegraph fr. Donna Ruffo Scalotta
to make an appointment -
Sciopero of postal clerks postponed
today - At Naples - the bakers have
struck - Have not gone out this
aft - waited all day and no one
came - Gen Caselli called
about 6:30 and I am to go
sometime tomorrow to the Library
with him - Met Mrs. Thompson
friend of Mr. Hampson. She is
English.

Last night after I was in bed -

Roma ^{1st Bahai talk}
in Italy

a telegraph message came from Principe Ruffo - I told them to phone this morning - It seems Donna Nives and a sister came at ten & the boy did not find me. They came at 12:30 and I was in. Donna Nives is quite a young girl - a surprise to me. She has arranged for me to be at least at a sister's house - Contessa Spalletti Ruffo - a few friends will be there. A note came from Gen. Caselli - He is to go to Library at 4:30 - Eve.

At 4:15 Gen. Caselli came and took me to the Dato-Americana Library - in Palazzo Salviati, 271 Corso Umberto I. Mr H. Nelson Gay is the American whose efforts have bro't it about. Carnegie Institute has donated about 1/3 of the books. Mr Gay will gladly receive the Bahai literature, but for cataloguing he wants that which pertains to America - He will gladly have the "Talks in America" by G. B. or any articles in American Magazines. Asked me to let him know when I return to Rome. A genial man. Went to tea with Gen. Caselli's sister.

At dinner got in conversation with an American lady at next table - finally going to her room with a "B.B." and having a good talk - She was much attracted. Mrs J. Dimey Carpenter the villa at Leghorn.

General informed me that on mother's side Nives Ruffo Scalletti is from Borgese family - once much on Pope's side.
Clear. Jan 30 - Sunday.
Clear. After breakfast at nine went for walk up the Gradini and near the Park. At lunch took goodbye to Mrs Carpenter. Felt some depressed about the day - said prayer 1001 times.

At 4:30 went to Villa Ruffo Scalletti - met the father, very plain, agreeable man. About twenty - men & women gathered - Princess Proghese had been to Persia - met Nicolai and Kueen of the movement, so I was immediately challenged. I had no intention of telling the story, but did with many questions asked, gave a rather disconnected talk which, however pleased they they said. A few deeply impressed. Marchese Cavriani - will read

Last eve Gen Caselli phoned to say that his sister wished to have a tea and invite friends to hear about the Cause if I would remain. Thursday was named, so I cannot leave until Friday. Truly the doors are opening here.

Gen Caselli called at six - remained an hour talking of the teachings. He invited me to meet his family here. No letter from E. Torlonia giving appointment.

Spoke a little to Mr & Mrs. Thompson with Miss Thompson listening about the teachings.

Feb 1 - Tuesday

A heavy thunderstorm in the night. Rained until afternoon - About 4 - went out

and stopped at Cinema.

No word from Sig. & Torlonia.

Dinner time Gen Caselli phoned that his sister Donna Olga Orlando, Piaz. Esquilino I asked me to have informal dinner with them tomorrow night. - Have been reading "Women in White" by W. Collins - read all day. Wrote to Agis - and Kathryn.

Feb 2 - Wednesday

Rainy - Went out and got into a thunderstorm about 4 P.M. bought a pair of white gloves for Thursday - a meeting at Sig. Orlando's house.

At 7:30 Gen Caselli came and took me to his sister's home - very palatial - She is a handsome and intelligent woman. Her husband is a builder - sparkling black eyes - very interesting. We proceeded to dinner and then they kept me talking all evening until 10 to eleven. - Fortunate that I brought my black dress (new).

The customs in society are a little new to me here - I must enquire. May God open these hearts to the light, that other hearts may know.

Fair, clear. Feb 3 Thursday
Midday.

Miss Thompson invited me to her "balcony" - and we visited a little.

At 4. I took a cab and drove to Sig^{ro} Orlando's - She regretted a number had not been able to be present, but about five the room had filled and about 25 were present.

Prof. Sig Valleri - writer, philosopher was most tenacious, but earnest -
Sig Mili - philosopher - interested -
Conte Carlo Stelluti Scala - and a signora - interested -

Wonder of all - I found I had to speak in Italian - rather difficult until questions were asked - A very intellectual set of people - Sig^{ro} Orlando is very sweet and natural - brought me home in auto - Gen Caselli - sat near to help me.

Conte Stelluti Scala asked to call this morning. I had planned to leave today. When he came, he said he would like me to speak to some friends this evening at his home - I said I would.

He came at 3 p.m. today he had planned - He told me of a Sig Mori, former sacerdote, excommunicated who would be present, had read something about it; that Naples

is a splendid center, and he would give me some letters - How marvelous! And is the spirit not directing and opening the ways!

I think that the family Ruffo Sealotta, strong church people, should be the ones to open the way here! Is this not a miracle?

Abdul Bahá's spirit is certainly present!

Conte Stelluti Scala came at nine and took me to his home where I was introduced to his mother the Countess. About 20 men were gathered representing literati - writers, philosophers. Sig M. - who was excommunicated for some of his writings I had to speak in Italian - Got home at 12:30 - ~~to~~ Came with me; is going to Germany & I shall send him some addresses.

18 Sept. Sunday.

Is it possible that I am lonely! Feel quite lost. Wrote 6 letters - Very warm -

19 Sept. Monday

Rained during night - very cool this morning. More stockings arrived from Polo - At 3:30 when I was

leaving the house to go and meet Alice B., just at foot of stairs leading into Pensione Finge, I evidently missed the bottom step for I found myself suddenly, on the floor with an atrocious pain in my right ankle - just could react the bell, so they came and picked up & sprained ankle, rather strained I think. What will Alice think! Come to bed. Dr. Salla says it is not serious - but means a few days laid up. What good angel has caused this and why? Had a massage!

Tuesday - 20 Sept.

Anniversary of Garibaldi's entrance to Rome! - Woman came and massaged my ankle - hope it helps. Alice came this afternoon. Mr & Mrs Eales left for Florence. Very nice people. Letters from P. - & flowers from Stacy at Anchorage - No word from E. - strange!

21 Sept - Wednesday

22 Sept - Thursday -

in Paris 6:30 Sunday morn. The

23 Sept. Vendredi.

About three today while studying
Persian, a strong feeling of being
in England passed over me. I

23 Sept. Saturday.

Went shopping with Antoinette.
Voyaged -

warm 7 Oct. Venerdì

Cinzia and I went out. Tried
in my paletot. Got my lavallier
from jewels - very pretty now -
travelled far -

8 Oct. Sabato

Weather very warm these days
Attack of goats during the night.
Got letter with check for \$150.00 -
Saw Amalia Adams at Antoinette's
Went to see Alice - they leave for
Vienna tomorrow 9th - their anniversary
9 Oct. Domenica

14 Oct. Venerdì

Found note at books that Louise and John Borschi had arrived. Went to hotel, they were out - found they had called here at 7 P.lebisceite.

15 Oct. Sabato

Went to dentist at 11:45 - took some milk for luncheon and then went to see Louise B. - We had afternoon together. They will go to Haifa. Long letter from Lady giving troubles in Cause. Cashed my check for 150. @ 25.20 - on Wednesday.

16 Oct. Domenica

Did not go out. wrote letters.

17 Oct. Lunedì

Went to luncheon with the Borschi's

Afternoon we had tea at Biffi's. They leave tomorrow for Venice.

18 Oct. Martedì

Shopped with Auntie - we called on Antonette. Sig. Bontasogli & Tonini were there.

19 Oct. Mercoledì

At 8:10 took train for Erba. Arr. Forni met me and we drove to their place above Cuneina. It overlooks the valley from a grove of Chestnuts. Lisclika is a real contadina now. They live there all the year. She has now a boy she calls "Carlino" - one she has cured.

21 Oct. Venerdì

Had a nice visit. Read "Bilychnis" - religious journal pub. at via Crescenzi 2. Roma. Left today at 4:40 arr. at Milano 6:30 - Auntie did not expect me.

22 Oct. Sabato

With Auntie went to dentist. He soldered the tooth - bridge - in. Afternoon shopped, met Antonette at Margareti Pasticceria. She is now convinced that there is something about Alice and Ed. Auntie thinks she may remain here with Alice a few months.

23 Oct. Domenica
Remained in all day. More
letters.

24 Oct. Lunedì
Went to dentist. Paid for

25 Oct. Martedì.

be there. I came home with
Auntie.

26 Oct. Mercoledì
Went for my furor. Met Aunt. went
shopping, had tea in Galleria Cristoforo.

27 Oct. Giovedì -
Cable from Mas on saying "Violation
Crisis coming. Board bewildered.
Suggest you write." What can I
write? To Board might irritate.

28 Oct. Venerdì -
Called at A's. Then she + Sig. Bardegnani
met me at 5. We had tea at Cooperating

Letter from Tomi giving Carlotta from
Sig M. - who has found a Pension
for me at 11 lire a day at Torino.
Also got to pairs of gloves @ 20.120
for Mrs. Ponsignori, sent them to Venice
for the Boschi's to carry to Alexandria.

29 Ottobre Sabato.
Decided to go and see Alice P.
She had gone out, but we met in
the street. She was same as usual.
I said nothing. Strange! Got above
for Auntie. When in Via Turino we
saw a woman knocked down by tram.
Fortunately only her face hurt. With
blood streaming down, I on one side,
a man on other, we took her to a
near pharmacy. After getting letters
at books - we had tea in Via
Maurandini - then came home.

30 Ottobre - Domenica
Remained in & wrote letters.
Played - "Scoping" with Giulio.

31 Ottobre - Lunedì
Started out with Auntie. She
had that acute pain in
thigh, but kept on. Went to
Esperanto rooms in via
Rasari 2. Got names of students
in different places. Will try and
go to meetings when I return from
Torino. Went to Antoinettes.

Milano - Torino

1 Nov Martedì
Went out this aft. but all
shops were closed. At Aunt's
found Sig^{ro} Bartesaghi and
Tonini. All came out together
Sig^{ro} B + Tonini going together,
Aunt + Nino in another direction.
This is giorno di nascita di
Giulio so we had big dinner.
Auntie + I got him a vestaglia.

2 Nov. Mercoledì
Took cab, went to books and
then to station. Train left
Milano at 12.55 + arrived
at Torino, Porta Nuova, at
4 P.M. Went first to Hotel
Suisse Terminus just across
from station and took a room.

Dr. Cav. Manzetti had written
the Sig^{ro} Forri he had found
a place for me. Went to the
P.O. + found him. He gave me
address + I came out to say I
would move tomorrow. Had
dinner and went to bed.

3 Nov Giovedì
Had breakfast at 9. Came
to Amadeo Peyron at 11. The
people are very kind - the room
pleasant, all for 11 lire a day.
If cold comes I shall feel it

for there is no heating. There is
one daughter. This aft. went
to call on Sig^{ra} Giulia Bensa
She is very pleasant. We
talked of religion and of the
Bahai Cause. A Dominican
came in. She is one of the "Polainie
de la Lampada". She asked me
to be at her house next Thursday,
when a certain pole would speak
about Poland, also to call Monday.
She seems interested. - how much
we shall see.

4 Nov. Venerdì
Wrote yesterday to Mrs. Morra
also Sig. Veggiani. Today went
with the Sig^{ro} K. and his daughter
down town, we walked going first
to the Chiesa Concolada. The Madonna
with beads hanging over the altar
with diamond crowns, and she
a diamond necklace. The church
is in gold-leaf. - many cupolas.
When arrivd here found Mrs
Morra had called, leaving note
that she would be home Sunday +
asked me to tea.

Rained a little. 5 Nov. Sabato.
Went to see Cav. Manzetti to thank
him. He is deeply impressed in
this "dirt" cure. Thinks he does

more good than I - so he said -
Went to 57 Duca di Genova to
find Bice Vaccarino, but she had
moved - I was shown her villa
across Piazza d'Arme - she
was not in - will return tomorrow.

6 Nov. Domenica
After writing letters - one to
Anne Flint - start to see
Bice V. Found her much changed.
She was 16 when I last saw her
now she is 36. Delighted to see me -
most cordial - invited me Wednesday
for lunch. She has two boys - a
beautiful villa they have on
Giuseppe Galliani - 10 - Bice
took me out to train no 1, so
that I arrived exactly at Sym
Morra. Very natural & pleasing
person. Had a lovely tea. Am
to go Tuesday. Both of these were
interested in the teachings. May
the Bahá'í's all open their
hearts.

7 Nov. Lunedì.
Getting much colder. Went
local on Leg. Benso - She
gave me some information about
the "Unione internazionale delle
donne cristiane liberali" for
which she gives most of her

time. We also spoke of the Cause
Left there I walked to Piazza
Vittorio along the portico to
P. Castello, took via Roma, went
to P.O. then to Corso Vittorio
Emanuele - along the portico to
C. Vengaglio, Arnaia, J. Martini
to via Cibraia, a casa - an
hour and a half.

8 Nov. Martedì
Went early to Mr Morra - we
had tea then went to U.M.C.A.
via San Seconda St, near C.
Vitt. Em. - We went shopping
to find a warm dress - what
I liked was too dear. 5.50 -
She took a cab and bro't me
home. a nice visit.

9 Nov. Mercoledì.
Cold. Went to lunch with
Bice Vaccarino - She has a
beautiful home, elegantly kept.
Her husband is interesting, very
cordial. - sumptuous lunch.
B + I talked seriously until 5 -
when she went to her mother's
and I went in search of a
warm sweater - no success.
Left some literature for B,
she seems to comprehend
and accept.

10 Nov. Lunedì

Am freezing in the house, and outside too. A small stove in kitchen is all the heat we have. At four went to meeting at Sigra Giulio Basso. An Avv. spoke on his visit to Poland. He is a disciple of Tor, a Polish mystic.

My Guy came. He spoke of another article Prof. Macchiore has written in Evangelista on Balasi Cause. I have sent for article. Got long letter fr. Mason, telling of bad conditions of Cause. N.Y. will not stand against the Kirchner violation. Cox, Mills, Harris, would not stand with Washington Assembly, neither Harry Randall - What is coming?

11 Nov. Venediti

Sigra Mrs Morra called for me at 11:30 and took me to "Alfieri" for lunch - a very elaborate one. Went to hair house for a white then we went to Morice - a fine place with ante-salon for libite. They are exceedingly kind & hospitable. not good for my quiet life. Yesterday decided to get a narrow dress, so got a black maffia

550 lire - hope to keep warm. Am praying for offerings - while working with individuals.

12 Sabato -

Town after lunch - at 10 to 2 - Sigra Angelini went with me to do various commissions - particularly to find a stove. We walked for nearly three hours - had tea - found a French stove; got wool to knit a jacket - silk to make a skirt etc. In eve I went with them to a dance given by Impiegati Civili - got back about 10:45.

13 Nov. Domenica

Remained in all day. Wrote letters retired at 8.

14 Nov. Lunedì

A little rain - not so cold. Note from Mrs Morra that she could not go to Sigra Basso with me. A cause connected with Federazione Studenti spoke on condition of students in Poland - Russia - etc. Mr Nelson, Mr Guy, and Mr were present and spoke. Sigra Giulio asked me to speak to the Circle of Liberal Christian Workers, a week from Thursday. - so I shall remain. Went to see Mrs Morra. She has invited a friend for Wednesday to come about the Cause.

15 Nov. Martedì.

Did some chopping - had tea on Via Roma, then went to call on Sig^{ra} Dubino, & a Marco Polo's. Contessa Visme gave me her name as a Theosophist - interested in the "religion" side. I found her completely absorbed in the Theosophy. She gave me a book of Leadbeater's on the Eucharist to read. Met a man whose name I do not remember. If any result - we shall see.

16 Nov. Mercoledì.

Mrs Morra Leadbeater's Oreglia there to hear about the Cause. She is promising I am to meet her Sunday morning at the Valdese Church. Got a letter fr. Georgia saying she is returning to America - going to Paris first - & Cairo soon. News that Mrs Bourgeois has lost her mind, and that the Kings are on way to Haifa - B. not well -

17 Nov. Giovedì

Afternoon went into house Pice V. Had tea. She had read the books & is deeply interested. I gave her the french copy of T. Valley's

She is not well. I feel that she really believes. - Enrolled Comets.

18 Nov. Venerdì.

Stopped. Went to see Sig^{ra} Guidis - She does not feel deeply the Cause. I subscribed to International Women's Liberal Christian Movement.

Got letter from Mr Macpherson that perhaps Cal. Oil Co. will cease paying dividends - another 24.00 less a month. More economy in all ways.

19 Nov. Sabato

Weather still good. Expected to meet Sig^{ra} Guidis at Simulpanna's - a roman's assoc. - Maria di Borro at head. - Called at Sig^{ra} Morra to leave some Bazaar literature. Letter from Mason - about conditions - wh. are very bad he says. I have little hope that New York will stand firm - they do not understand!

20 Nov. Domenica

At 15 to 11 I met Sig^{ra} Oreglia and we went to Valdese Church and heard the minister P. speak. He is very broad, and seems a spiritually awakened soul. At 3 I went to her house to meet a man & wife Sig^{ra} Levi
